Dear Ashford Families.

The COVID-19 pandemic, and all of the precautions being initiated by our state leaders, are having an overwhelming impact on many members of our community. Some of you may need to stay at home or increase day care; and maybe live without adequate income because of your work situations. There is no doubt that this is a real hardship for many. We are doing our best here, and thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate through this uncharted territory. We hope that you have found some ways to balance your new work and "school-at-home" learning lives with your families. Here is an update on Ashford School plans moving forward and some suggestions on how to achieve a productive balance for your children.

School Closure Status

We are currently closed with no clear indication of when we will reopen. Neither the Governor nor the Connecticut Commissioner of Education have given us a re-opening date. However, on March 24th, Governor Lamont gave an indication that it is not out of the realm of possibilities that schools may remain closed until the fall. The Governor has said that, at this time, we cannot open prior to April 20th.

Currently, only a few staff members are allowed in the school building each day for cleaning, food preparation and distribution, and necessary office work.

The paper packets will be available for pick-up Monday, March 30^{th} through Thursday, April 2^{nd} , and Monday, April 6^{th} through Thursday, April 9^{th} , from 8:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. We will be distributing work for two weeks at a time. Please note that the online work and the paper packets do not necessarily contain the same material. Teachers will be available to answer questions and provide feedback to students via email.
